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#### 1 Introduction & Activity Overview

- 1.1 Logical Safety Solutions, hereafter referred to as LSS, has been appointed by London Youth Games, hereafter referred to as LYG, to provide a Safety Plan and various Risk Assessments to cover their works throughout the 2022-2023 LYG Season. This RA will cover the Summer Finals activity that take place in QEOP.
- 1.2 Information relating to the event is as outlined in the emails and discussions between Eleanor Western (LSS) and Lucy Baines of LYG along with information provided in supplied project documentation.
- 1.3 The finals event this year will take place at various venues within the Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park. The Final competitions will take place in each venue in isolation, there will be no prizegiving activity and no 'borough village'.
- 1.4 There will not be an event village, however LYG have appointed an external agency (LimeLight Sports) to create an activation area on East Cross Square adjacent to the Copper Box Arena.
- 1.5 The activation area will comprise of:
  - Double deck bus with activations inside
  - Stage with performances and prizegiving activity

LYG have engaged with five National Governing Bodies (NGB's) who will provide have a go activity sessions within the activation area. All activations will be required to submit a risk assessment and safeguarding measures. This will include:

- NFL Flag
- England Squash
- Futsall
- Orienteering
- Cricket

This Activation area will be managed by LimeLight Sports who will provide a Risk Assessment to cover their works.



LYG will also have a VIP area within this space, this will be used for hospitality for their VIP guests. Food and drink will be served here including alcohol.

#### 2 Risk Matrix

#### 6x6 – Risk Assessment Definitions, Ratings and Matrix Guide

The purpose of a risk assessment is to identify significant hazards, those controls established to eliminate or minimise risk and to prioritise those additional actions required to remove or further reduce the hazard thereby reducing the likelihood of a hazardous event occurring and/or the potential consequences of such an event.
